What We Play

We are primarily classical musicians who play keyboard, brass, woodwind, and stringed instruments. Examples of the types of ensembles we form are:

- Brass trios, quartets, and quintets
- Woodwind trios, quartets, and quintets.
- String trios, quartets, quintets, sextets, octets.
- Mixed ensembles such as woodwind and string quartets and other groupings for specific pieces.
- Piano trios, quartets, and quintets with various instruments.
- Chamber orchestras* (future events)

Organization

Informal Play-In or Meet-Up events

are held at sacred spaces, homes, and other locations with multiple rooms for groups to play in. Members pre-register with event organizers and may have the option to prearrange pieces or groups with other members. Using ACMP guidelines, groups are assigned rooms and may switch around during the event. Events usually last for 2-3 hours, are flexible, and are a great way to meet other musicians in your area.





Informal concerts are given on occasion at the Evanston Masonic Temple or other locations at the request of volunteers.

Repertoire

Knowing that ensembles live and die by the availability of pieces to play, we have assembled a large and growing collection of pieces and portfolios for ensembles featuring winds, strings, and keyboard. We also have obtained a variety of digital libraries. In addition, we are willing to print materials from online public resources such as the imslp.org digital library project on request.

Printed materials from digital libraries are cleaned up, cropped, printed with correct pagination on high quality paper using laser printers, and comb bound with sturdy covers.

Having a variety of works including flexible mixed instrument arrangements on hand at events allows musicians to reorganize as needed. Current listings of available materials are at www.northwestsymphony.org/ChamberMusic.html.
